ANTI-TRAFFICKING PROGRAMME

In 2002, ICMPD recognised the accumulation of political will and the readiness of the governments of its Member states to add to their migration agenda the response to the transnational organised crime and particularly to trafficking in human beings (THB).

A team of experts was gathered to work specifically on THB topic, to partner with other international organisations and to develop ICMPD expertise in the field.

For 20 years, the ICMPD Anti-Trafficking Programme (ATP) has been providing expertise and supports governments in the development and implementation of their anti-trafficking legal and institutional frameworks, such as strategies and action plans, as well as the development of national and transnational referral mechanisms for trafficked persons.


ATP supports national authorities by developing varying sets of tools like Standard Operating Procedures, Indicators, Training Programmes, Thematic analyses, and Studies. ATP extends from South-East Europe and the EU, to West and East Africa, Central and South-East Asia, the Middle East, and South America.
