Refugi.Arte em Marvila continues

is a de-industrialised area with high concentration of social housing and mix of urban poor which includes native Portuguese and, increasingly, migrants and refugees in extreme vulnerability. As with other such poor neighbourhoods, due to the onset of the economic crisis it has been prone to growing rates of xenophobia. However, at the same time, a process of gentrification has seen an increasing attraction to the neighbourhood of wealthy young groups. This social transformation represents an opportunity for developing social and spatial inclusion of residents.

from two previous experiences which devised a participatory approach to transform a heritage building, Marques de Abrantes, into a multicultural art-based inclusive housing shelter for deprived residents and refugees, as part of a district revitalisation project.
