## WHO WE ARE

The European Return and Reintegration Network (ERRIN) is a Member State-driven initiative, facilitating cooperation between migration authorities. Operational since 2018, 16 European countries currently participate in ERRIN, with membership open to any EU Member State or Schengen-associated country. The European Partner Institutions (EPIs), along with the European Commission (DG Migration and Home Affairs) and the European Border and Coast Guard Agency (EBCGA/FRONTEX) constitute the Management Board, which drives the agenda and sets priorities.

Activities are coordinated by the Brussels-based Programme Management Unit (PMU). The International Centre for Migration Policy Development (ICMPD) provides expertise and administrative support as implementing partner. ERRIN is funded through the EU's Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund (AMIF), with co-financing from participating national agencies.



# WHERE WE ARE ACTIVE

The ERRIN network is working with four organisations, the French Office for Immigration and Integration (OFII) and the network of European Reintegration Support Organisations (ERSO), which offer comprehensive assistance for returning migrants. We are currently operating in 40 countries. All service partners have undergone a rigorous selection process and sign up to a code of conduct that clearly sets out expectations for the delivery of the services.





# IT WORKS

Nationals of selected third countries (see map) who wish or have to return from an ERRIN partner country may be eligible to benefit from the programme. This can include applicants for international protection in the middle of a procedure, asylum seekers who have been rejected, or immigrants who have never applied for international protection. Often it concerns migrants who want to leave, but who do not have the financial or logistical resources to do so.
