POLICY & RESEARCH

To better understand and make sense of migration, ICMPD draws on its own specialised expertise, located at Headquarters, in two closely related units: Policy and Research. As an intergovernmental migration organisation with one foot in scientific research and the other in the world of government policy and international relations, ICMPD is uniquely placed to provide new perspectives and propose solutions for improved policy development and implementation.

The **Policy Unit** was established in **2017** to conduct policy analysis and increase the organisation's contributions to policy debates.

It works to **make sense of migration** and put forward **new ideas and insights** to improve migration policy.

Current priorities include responses to **Ukrainian displacement**, the **integration** of migrants and refugees, and **complementary pathways** to protection.

The **Research Unit** has been carrying out research on salient migration issues since 1997.

The aim is to further knowledge on migrationrelated issues linked to migration governance in a wider European context, facilitate cooperation and synergy within and beyond the research community, and respond to the demand for more policyrelevant research.

Current priorities include questions on **migration decision-making**, **social cohesion** and (labour market) **integration** of displaced persons, and **migration trends and dynamics**.

The Research and Policy Units maintain (partially joint) portfolios consisting of third-party and internally funded initiatives and projects. Both units are also tasked with undertaking policy and research-related activities in support of ICMPD's geographic units in four thematic areas.

The overarching themes of the Policy Unit and the Research Unit's work are:



MIGRATION GOVERNANCE AND POLICY-MAKING

Migration governance architecture, institutions and frameworks, multi-level policy making and sustainable partnership approaches, as well as migration and its regulation.

MIGRATION TRENDS AND DYNAMICS

Various forms of mobility, migration routes and public debates about it, as well as migration decision-making.



INTEGRATION AND SOCIAL COHESION

Integration of migrants and refugees, communication, as well as social cohesion in host societies.

SAFE MIGRATION, DISPLACEMENT AND PROTECTION

Asylum and refugee policies and practices, responsibility-sharing, access to protection and alternative pathways to protection, as well as refugee surveys.
