



European Return and Reintegration Network Project in Armenia (ERRIN-Armenia)

November 2018 November 2022

Objective: fostering government-to-government cooperation on delivery of post-arrival assistance as well as to strengthen Armenia's migration management capacities and to support social and economic reintegration of Armenian nationals who return voluntarily or involuntarily from EU and ERRIN Member States.



Construction of a new Temporary Accommodation Centre (TAC) for asylum seekers

November November 2018 2022

Objective: assisting the Armenian government in better managing migration in the context of reception and accommodation of asylum seekers. The realisation of the TAC is also aimed at lifting the Armenian refugee protection infrastructure on a par with the neighbouring countries. The completion of construction is scheduled for April 2022.

EU Support to Strengthening IBM in Ukraine (EU4IBM)

December June 2019 2022

Objective: Ukrainian citizens benefit from increased mobility and economic operators are better integrated into the world economic exchange flows, while a high level of security and prevention of cross-border crime is ensured.





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Forced-Return Monitoring III - Work Package 7 (FReM III)

December May 2018 2021

Objective of WP7: building and/or further strengthening the capacity of forced-return monitors in third countries (Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine), participating in collecting return operations (CROs) through training of forced-return monitoring bodies.

Co-implementing partners: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, the Czech Republic, Finland, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Latvia, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Sweden and Switzerland as well as the European Border and Coast Guard Agency (Frontex) and the European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights (FRA)

Funded by: 90% the European Union, 10% participating states



Migration Resource Centre in Tajikistan (MRC TAJ)

January December 2020 2021

Objective: improving migration governance and mobility through the establishment of a responsive, efficient and sustainable Migrant Resource Centre (MRC) as well as reducing vulnerabilities and challenges faced by migrants in working and living abroad by providing them with adequate, timely and reliable information and guidance on migration in Tajikistan. Project is implemented within the framework of the Budapest Process and linked with the project "Improving Migration Management in the Silk Routes Countries".



December **February**

Objective: contributing to a functioning return system in the Republic of Moldova in compliance with human rights as enshrined in relevant international, regional and national legislation and protecting the human rights of returnees through independent and transparent forced return monitoring.
